### 16 Hymns of Today for use as Simple Anthems

(20 copies)

These are arranged with introductions and suggestions for varied treatment of verses (e.g. Unison, Harmony, Solo, Sopranos with other parts humming). The tunes range from Traditional English, Thomas Tallis, Jeremiah Clarke to tunes of today.

### 21 Hymns of Today for use as Simple Anthems

A similar collection to 16 Hymns of Today. It includes tunes by Orlando Gibbons, Jeremiah Clarke, Bach, Stanford, Wood and Harwood as well as living composers.
